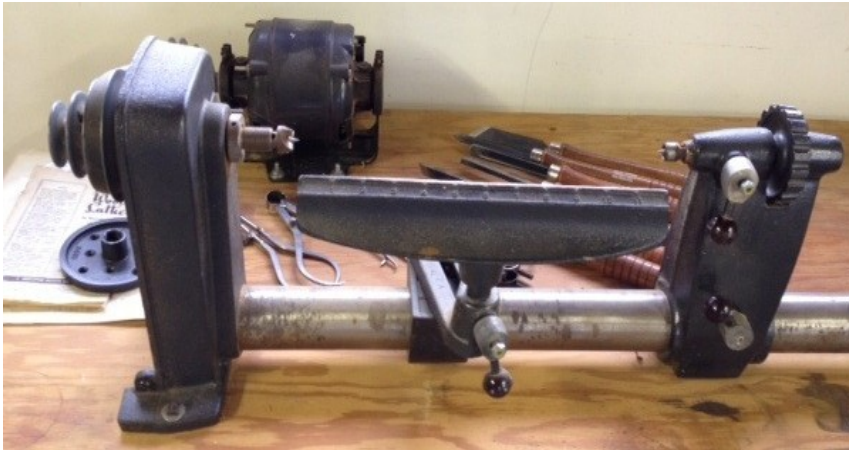

The Commander of the Salvation Army was introduced in preparation of the presentation of the toys made for the Salvation Army's annual Toy Giveaway at Christmas. Members of the Club lined up behind their respective toys they made, identified, and spoke briefly about the toy. One hundred and thirteen pieces were made for this year's Christmas Giveaway. The members' name and toy is: Dean Bartels & Ken Walleser/knockdown rocking chairs, Pat Vollbrecht/ kaleidoscopes, Gene Knief/doll rocking chairs, Bob Hewlitt/ airplane rocking horses, Dennis Gilroy/ race cars, Dave Turner/ fan-back children's chairs, Warren Brecheisen/ old time model wooden cars, Roger Jordan/ Adirondack chairs, Reed Craft/ boxed sets of wooden train with various cars, Jerry Krug/ end loader, Bob Jefferson/ colorful grasshopper pull-along toys, Dick Buchanan/ smiley-face piggybanks w/ secret opening, Jim Waring/ variety of wooden puzzles of various design, collaboratively, Barb Gurney, Garylee Thurm, Paul & Wanda Bailey, et al/ doll houses with respective furniture pieces. The raffle tickets were won by Bob Anderson, choosing the set of Clamps and Mr. Tom Gloviak won the sanding block with the second raffle ticket drawn. The annual Business Meeting was held next. Asking if there was any "old" business that needed to be brought up, and queried 3 times, there was no response. A source of rough wood pieces, in a variety of species, was made available, for sale, by Sid Sidler. the detail of location, phone #, etc. will be listed in the monthly newsletter. Bill Neal announced that he has 4 doors [hollow-core] available free to any Club member that would like them. The sizes are; 3- 36" doors, 1- 28" door. Our Nov. program was presented by Mr. Barclay Lawder, as well as his wife, Jackie, also present is from Amana, IA and talking about his "handle" as an Artist-Prototypes-Toy Designer. Board members present were included; Dennis Gilroy, Mark Jensen (new), Bob Anderson, Terry Duckworth, Bob Hewlitt, Wanda Bailey, Paul Bailey, Dave Turner, Reed Craft, Gene Knief, and Dan Grimes. Spousal/friend letters are constructed and would be going out announcing the Annual Christmas Party Event. Dues paid for the 2014 period are at twenty –so as to take advantage of the drawing for 1-free membership dues held at the January Club Meet. A bid of "Thank you!" was given to Bob Hewlitt in recognition for his ongoing job of coordinating and finding program speakers for the monthly Club meets. Relative to the Treasurer's Report, it was mentioned that the Club has not had to provide "gas money" for our program speakers that have to travel from outside the Cedar Valley area. Gene Knief mentioned that he handed out CVWA business cards to several shoppers at the Bev. Wildey

Tool Sale held last month. Dave Turner sent out a Thank You letter to the Nov. Program speaker, Mr. B. Lawder. One hundred thirteen toys items were presented to this year's Salvation Army Toy Giveaway. The minutes of the "Annual Business Meeting", held in November every year will be sent out, I believe in January 2014 to be put on file with the Club's attorney as required in By-laws and as a 501.3C status. We discussed whether we need to change the By-laws, relative to the annual picnic. By-laws state that the picnic is to be held in August every year. In recent years it has been changed to Sept. By-law rules will be reviewed and amended if needed. Dennis Gilroy, heading up the annual Christmas Party, reviewed the desired time-table chronology for the evening event. Stating: 4:30 setup, 6PM show-n-tell items need to be entered/categorized, 6:15 voting starts, 6:30 meal starts, 6:45 voting cutoff. 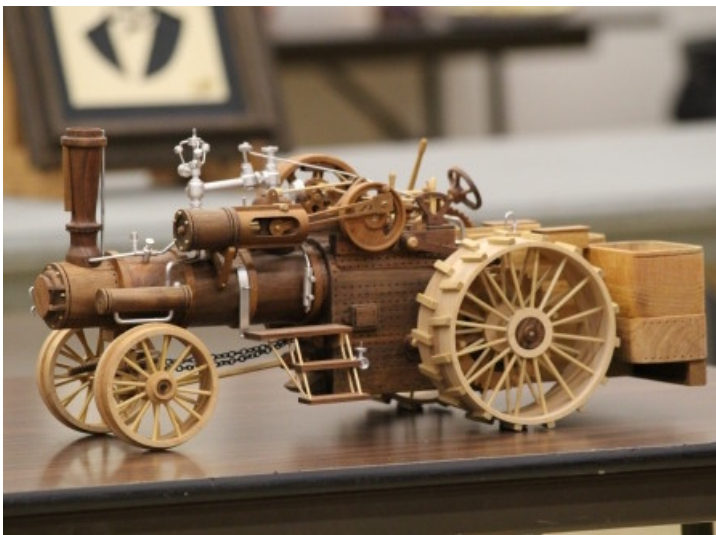


Upper Left: Sid Sidler's Abe Lincoln in silhouette

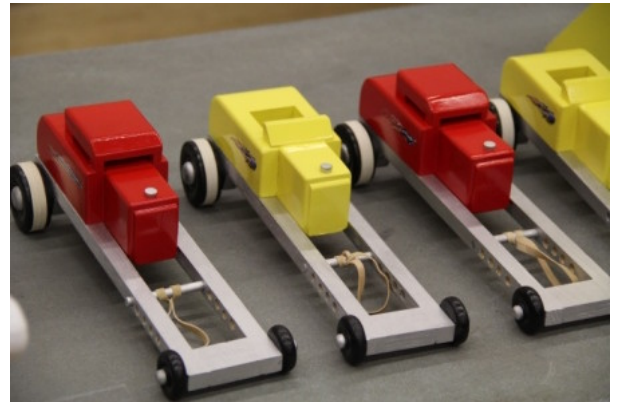
